

# Hind Inline Ocarina Kit

## Instructions

Congratulations on your purchase of the Hind inline ocarina kit. Your ocarina is made from a very fine African hardwood called Sapele (pronounced suh-pee'-lee).

1. Carefully lift the top plate from the body of the ocarina. There are two register pins that position the parts together. Remove the two pins and store them in a safe location.

2. Use sandpaper or a file to remove any wood fibers or fuzziness from the chamber, finger holes, and windway area.

3. Replace the top and look through the windway from the mouthpiece end of the ocarina. The edge of the lip will be visible and should appear in the middle (vertically) of the windway (Fig. 1). Use a small file or sandpaper to smooth the angled lip on both sides (inside and outside of the instrument). When the lip is adjusted properly, you will be able to see some space above it and below it when viewing through the windway.

4. When all looks good, use a small brush to apply sealer to the inside of the chamber, up the inside walls, and the underneath side of the top plate (see Fig. 2 & 3). Do not get sealer outside the line on the underside of the top plate, because the glue might not adhere to it properly.

5. When the sealer is dry you can glue the two parts together. Examine both surfaces to be glued and remove any wood fibers, or other debris. Carefully spread a **THIN** layer of yellow wood glue onto both parts (Fig. 2 & 3). Be careful **NOT** to get glue in the windway area and wipe off most of the glue along the edge of the windway area so that none squeezes into the opening when the parts are put together. Place the register pins back into their holes and squeeze the two parts together. Apply clamps or a heavy weight until the glue is dry (1 or 2 hours). Be sure that no glue has squeezed into the windway. If necessary use a thin strip of cardboard or any small, thin object like a nail file to clean it out.

6. When the glue is dry, use sandpaper to smooth the outside to your liking and apply a wood finish such as oil, varnish, lacquer or shelac.






